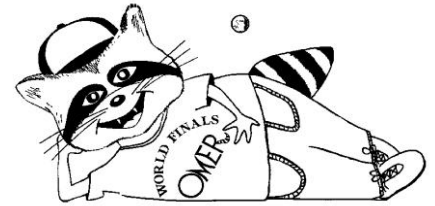

**Dear Baileywick Parents,**  
Dee Bostick, Baileywick Counselor

Did you know that the Baileywick Counseling Program is recognized as an ASCA (American School Counselor Association) National Model Program? This recognition gives us the privilege of using the ASCA Logo, which you see, adjacent to this article.

Because of the support I receive from Baileywick administration, parents, and staff, I am able to act as an advocate for each child at Baileywick. I have the wonderful job of supporting student success and the development of the whole child. I work closely with the PTA Counselor Advisory Committee to provide a comprehensive counseling program for all Baileywick students.

My role includes facilitating the implementation of the guidance curriculum in all classes. Some topics included in the North Carolina guidance curriculum that I address in classroom sessions are character education, conflict resolution, social skills, understanding and accepting the feelings of others as well as oneself, and transition. I work closely with the PTA Guidance Advisory Committee to provide a comprehensive counseling program for Baileywick students.

Another area I cover is called responsive services and includes providing individual and group counseling. Teachers and parents can refer students to the counselor for these services. Students can also make self-referrals by filling out the form found in their room or in the bulldog mailbox next to the counselor's office.

Individual planning is the third area covered by the counselor. This includes addressing academic achievement through providing classroom lessons or leading small groups on such topics as test taking skills and study skills. The counselor also serves on the Student Support Team who collaborates with parents to develop a learning plan for a student who is struggling.

The final component is system support, which includes teacher and parent consultation and education and program development and management. Some of the committees of which the counselor is a member include leadership team, the school Improvement committee, and the character education committee.

If you would like your child to be involved in a group led by the counselor or have an individual session with the counselor, or if you would like an appointment to discuss how best to support your child, please call Dee Bostick at 518-0078. You can also leave a note in the bulldog mailbox outside the counseling office or email me at [abostick@wcpss.net](mailto:abostick@wcpss.net). Below are listed some of the possible small group topics I may conduct during the year based on student need. If you feel your child could benefit from a small group experience, in your email or call, include your child's name, your name and number, the teacher's name, and the topic of interest:

I look forward to working with parents, teachers, and students to help make sure "the learner in every child is nurtured and inspired," just as Baileywick's mission statement proclaims.
